Our Beach has been extremely busy with not much room amongst the Cool Cabanas and some days at the moment it's hard to find a spot to sit.

Our Patrolling Members have been very busy looking after all the visitors on the beach. We have seen some dramatic rescues. Our Lifesavers are always on the ball and have carried out some excellent work. I should also point out the work from our local Lifeguards - we all appreciate the work and extra effort these guys put in as well.

It's obvious with the number of people training each day that competition is heating up. Good luck to all of our competitors moving into the different carnivals over the next couple of months.

Much work and planning is going on behind the scenes for the Aussie Titles. All sections of the competition teams need to be congratulated with their efforts thus far in fundraising funds for transportation of equipment to Perth. The Club will also be contributing considerable funds to help cover the costs.



At the moment the Club has applied for numerous grants for upgrades in and around the Club. We are still in the waiting phase to hear back if these grants have been successful or not. We are hopeful that we are successful.

These grants total approximately \$600 000 in building upgrades to the Club. They range from:

Complete refurbishment of the Bathrooms plus the Disabled Bathroom, removal of existing tiles in the 1st and 2nd foyer and re-tile, re-tile all stairwells, remove and re-tile tiles into the entry of the Bathrooms and installation of an automatic door to main entry to the Building.

Removal of the old Commercial Kitchen and replacing it with a modern purpose-built Commercial Kitchen designed for our needs.

Building an undercover Storage Area for Craft around the back of the Club as currently we have a shipping container storing the craft.

Upgrading of our Security in and around the Club by installing new Security Cameras to cover all areas of the building.

These grants, if successful, will be a major boost for our Club in appearance as well as the function of our operations in the Club. We have listened to the Members and their concerns and have worked hard to get these grants in.

In applying for these grants the Club has had to commit considerable funds as well. Some of these grant applications need a Club contribution of 25% to get them across the line.

Once we hear more about the outcomes of the grants we will be informing all members.





Sunsets is also thriving with business at the moment. The staff have been busy with many visitors enjoying the great food, cold drinks and the amazing view.





What makes our Club great Surf rescue ready and always available



Rescue Response Avoca Beach Shark Tower - Saturday 12 November 2022

On Saturday 12 November 2022 the after-hours emergency callout was activated for the Avoca Beach Surf Club through 000 to Surf Command. A serious incident took place 200m offshore from the Avoca Beach Shark Tower where three twelve-year-old boys were caught in a Rip. A fourth boy who was on the beach ran home to tell his mother that the boys had drowned. At approximately 6.03 pm a member of the public saw what was going on and contacted 000. That person remained online with the 000 Call Centre until the rescue was completed. At 6.09 pm Surf Command alerted the Avoca Beach SLSC emergency out of hours club callout. Avoca Lifesavers responded and were on the Beach three minutes after initial contact, at 6.12 pm.

From that point on the club rescue equipment room was opened, tasks allocated to first responders which included the All-Terrain Vehicle being dispatched with Rescue Boards and Lifesavers. At the same time three lifesavers paddled directly from the Club to the incident area, making it to the site and stabilizing the situation with the three children who at that time were exhausted but were fortunate to have a surfboard rider close by to keep their heads above water. Sea conditions at the time were varying with a 1 to 2 metre swell in the rescue area in challenging conditions with light fading.

Further coordination was undertaken from the Avoca Shark Tower and the Inflatable Rescue Boat was deployed from the Club and arrived soon after the rescue boards arrived to save the boys, assisted with patient stabilisation, transported the children back to the Avoca Beach Surf Club at approximately 6.40 pm. Other members from the club arrived and helped coordinate communications, first aid and medical support, including a Doctor who made himself available on-site.

The Police arrived with the mother at approximately 6.35 pm. The children were checked and apart from swallowing considerable water were all ok. By 7.10 pm all equipment had been secured and club members released.

A big thanks to the vigilance of the caller to 000, the 21 Avoca Lifesavers who responded and the volunteer Doctor. A great outcome by our lifesavers from our great Lifesaving community.

Go Fishing @ Avoca

More than 100 rock fishers walked away better educated in how to stay safe after Surf Life Saving NSW's popular rock fishing safety program, Gone Fishing, was successfully held at our Beach on 20 November. Participants were met with a beautiful day on the Central Coast as a total of more than 300 people – rock fishers and families – learned all about vital safety measures and skill-building techniques specific to the popular but often deadly pastime from experts, including Maritime NSW, Marine Rescue and the Department of Primary Industries.

Thanks to those who helped support the activity and undertake rescue demonstrations, to include a Rip demonstration.
