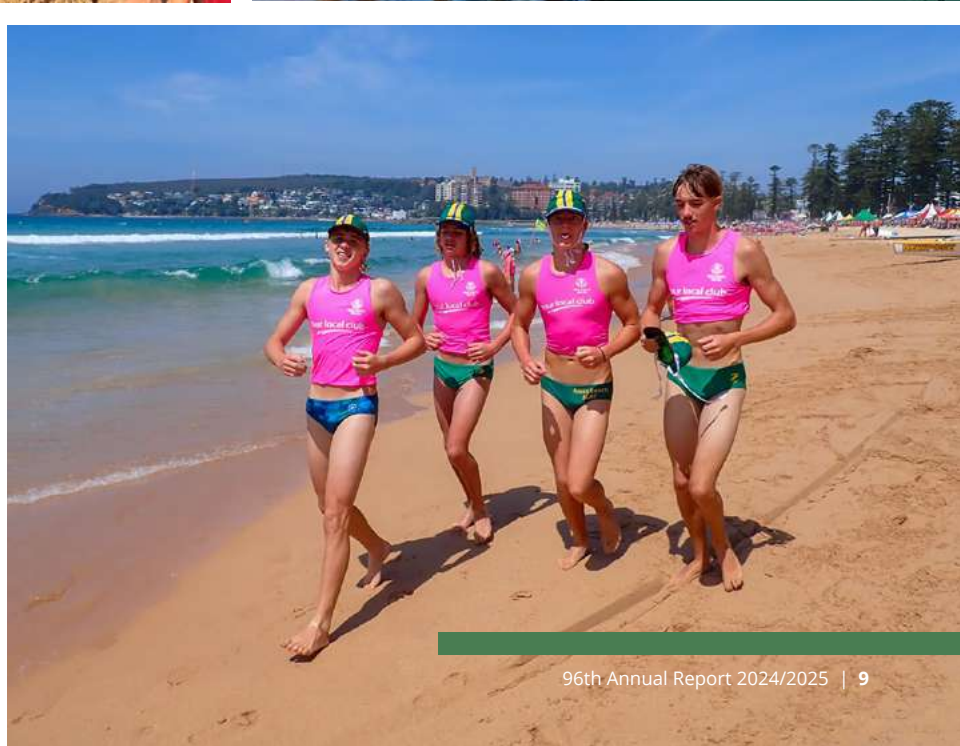

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

CLUB PRESIDENT, STUART HARVEY

It is with great pride that I present the President's Report for the 2024/2025 season of the Avoca Beach Surf Life Saving Club.

This season has once again demonstrated the strength, commitment, and passion of our club and its members. Our total membership reached 1,252, comprised of 543 females and 676 males, reflecting continued growth and inclusivity across all areas of the club.

Lifesaving Operations

The core of our mission – saving lives and ensuring beach safety – remains stronger than ever. Across the season, our 14 Patrol teams completed an outstanding 9,800 hours of volunteer patrol duty. These efforts resulted in 1,427 preventative actions and 50 rescues, a powerful reminder of the vital role our members play on one of the Central Coast's busiest beaches.

Our Patrol Captains have led their teams with professionalism and diligence

and we thank every one of them for their dedication in keeping our beach safe.

Education and Training

Education continues to be a pillar of our success. This season, our Education team achieved the following qualifications:

- 529 proficiencies completed
- 44 Bronze Medallions awarded
- 8 IRB Driver awards
- 15 IRB Crew awards
- 6 Radio Operator certificates
- 8 Advanced Resuscitation certificates
- 33 Surf Rescue certificates
- 19 Resuscitation certificates

These results reflect the tireless work of our educators: Jason Lauder, Joe Murray, Trent McRae, and Jeff Barnes. Their dedication has been crucial to maintaining the high standards of lifesaving knowledge and readiness within the club.

Junior Development (Nippers)

Our Junior program remains one of the strongest on the coast, with 397 young lifesavers actively participating throughout the season. These juniors have not only completed their relevant lifesaving awards but have also proudly represented Avoca at various surf sports events across the region.

Thanks must go to our Age Managers and Coaches who give countless hours to guide and mentor these children, helping them grow in confidence, skill, and team spirit.

Surf Sports and Competition

Avoca Beach SLSC continues to have a commanding presence at surf sports carnivals both locally and nationally. While many outstanding athletes will be acknowledged at our presentation evening, it is important to recognise all competitors for their commitment to training and improving their fitness – a key component of effective lifesaving.

One of the most notable achievements this season was the gold medal performance by Ella Beere and Natalia Drobot in the Open Female Double Ski event at the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships at North Kirra – a truly remarkable result.

Our athletes' success would not be possible without the leadership and skill of our coaching team across all disciplines – beach, craft, swim, and boats. Thank you for your continued commitment to performance and development.

Club Operations and Financials

Our club operations off the beach have also seen significant growth and success. The club's commercial arms – particularly the restaurant and bar – have experienced a large increase in activity during the summer season.

Key figures for 2024/2025 include:

- \$1.15 million in bar revenue
- \$1.4 million in kitchen revenue
- \$37,000 in member discounts applied
- Over 13,000 kids' meals served
- More than 10,500 schooners of Stone & Wood poured

Our hospitality operations have doubled in event volume, leading to the hiring of more staff – many of whom are club members. These figures highlight the popularity and community value of the Avoca Beach SLSC venue.

Our office, kitchen, and front-of-house staff have managed this growth admirably. Their work behind the scenes ensures that the club not only functions day-to-day but also continues to progress strategically and financially.

Sponsors and Supporters

The club is fortunate to receive support from a number of generous sponsors and community partners. Their ongoing contributions are critical to our ability to deliver training, patrol services, and community outreach. We thank each of them sincerely for their continued belief in our mission.

Final Reflections

Once again, no lives were lost on Avoca Beach while our patrols were on duty – a statistic we are incredibly proud to report. It reflects the preparedness, teamwork, and passion of our entire membership.

To all 1,252 members of the Avoca Beach SLSC – thank you. Whether on patrol, in training, in the surf boat, behind a counter, or supporting our juniors – you have made a difference this season. Your efforts uphold the reputation and values of our club, and you should be very proud.

Looking ahead, we know the bar has been set high. But with the strength of our membership, our leadership team, and our community, we are excited to take on the challenge of making the 2025/2026 season even more successful.

Let's continue to protect, serve, and represent Avoca Beach with pride.

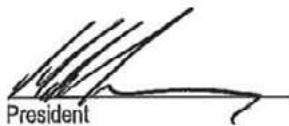

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*, the *Associations Incorporation Act 2009*, the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991* and associated regulations. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

Avoca Beach Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is an association registered under the *Associations Incorporations Act 2009* and domiciled in New South Wales.

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

These are special purpose financial statements that have been prepared for the purpose of complying with the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commissions Act 2012* and associated regulations. The Executive Committee have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members of the Avoca Beach Surf Life Saving Club Inc..

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the AASB and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements'; AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows'; AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors'; AASB 1048 'Interpretations of Standards'; AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures' as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities.

Accounting Policies

Revenue

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the company and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Sale of goods

Sale of goods revenue is recognised at the point of sale, which is when the customer takes receipt of the goods, the risks and rewards are transferred to the customer and there is a valid sales contract. Amounts disclosed as revenue are net of sales returns and discounts.

Functions and Events

Revenue from functions and events are recognised once the event is held in the Club facilities and has meet its obligations to provide a venue for the expressed purpose agreed with the parties.

Membership fees

Revenue from membership fees is recognised at time of receipt.

Grants and donations

Grant & donation income is recognised as revenue when received unless they are designated for a specific purpose, where they are carried forward as prepaid income on the balance sheet.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value

Buildings

Buildings are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event that the carrying amount of buildings is greater than its estimated recoverable amount the decrease in value is shown in the profit and loss statement as a revaluation decrease

Plant and Equipment / Surf Patrol Equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event the carrying amount of plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses are recognised in the profit or loss as revaluation decreases if the impairment losses relate to the revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets, including buildings and capitalised lease assets is depreciated on a straight line or diminishing-value basis over the asset's useful life to the entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are:

Class of Fixed Asset	Depreciation Rate
Plant and Equipment	5 – 66%
Surf Patrol & Sports Equipment	20%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at end of each reporting period.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with carrying amount. These gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss in the period which they arise. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included in other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Income Tax

As the company is a charitable institution in the terms of subsection 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the company during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

Comparative Figures

Where required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that may have a financial impact on the entity and that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

The Surf Club Bar & Bistro is recognised as one of the Central Coast's best destinations for great meals and the ideal place to meet family & friends for the best view anywhere on the East Coast of NSW. We are quickly gaining a reputation as a lead venue on the coast and this is all due to the work from the team, the vision of the Board & the patronage from our members & locals. Our success in 2025 has been amazing. With a mantra - "More people through our doors more often" we have executed a number of key strategic initiatives to achieve this. Pleasing to say with astonishing results.

- Annual revenue of \$2.6m (Record High) and growth of 37% over last year
- Collective revenue growth of the post covid years (2022 to 2025) is 133%

This can be attributed to many things but none more so than the dedication of our team. From the casuals on the floor through summer, to Michael Hunt & team in the kitchen but also Stuart Harvey for the tireless effort he continues to put into the operation to support the team. Special mention though to our Leadership Team and in particular Emma

Denniss who is our current lead in financial accounting but has stepped up to support the administration of our operation to ensure much improved rostering, job expectations & training. Similarly, Kristy Probst who has really taken the task to hand to drive greater awareness and appeal of our club and everything it has to offer. Functions have been a real driver of growth this year & will continue to be so in the years to come with a significant increase in weddings, birthdays, christenings - you name it. Pavarne Lambert has been instrumental in creating greater awareness locally and in Sydney for what our club offers for those looking to celebrate special occasions. She has streamlined and enhanced our offer and this has been hugely successful. So please, when looking to book your next function - Make OUR club top of YOUR list!

The start of every new season is always exciting with Michael Hunt launching a new menu each time and I think we would all agree the quality and variety on offer for food continues to improve to a level to be recognised as one of the best venues on the coast. We are very aware of the broad demographic that frequent

the club together with the competition locally. So, our position is to offer 'Pub Fare Plus' which includes everyone's favourites but at a high quality standard. From buying our own chicken breast and crumbing it ourselves (no wonder our schnitzels are the number one food item sold!) or making our own meat patties for our burgers - these are the things that make a difference. The current economic challenge is the cost-of-living for many Australians over the past few years. The biggest driver to this is obviously inflation. This is no different for our club. We have been hit with significant cost increases in all areas of the club, from food & beverages to utilities & rubbish removal. It all has an impact. Our leadership team do a good job to look at alternative options but inevitably there is an impact. Our choice when it comes to our menu is to go for cheaper quality and try to maintain prices where possible or work hard to continue to



find the best quality with the best value. We have chosen the latter as it's consistent with our strategy & this will require passing on a portion of this in our pricing. We will however always ensure we are competitive, but this may not always be just in price alone. Examples of this include our weekly specials board, a day of the week specials such as Seniors, Kids Eat Free or Steak night. Obviously, we also have our members discount and encourage you to continue to get great value through these vehicles.

Recently it was discovered that our current operation of previously Sunsets and now The Surf Club, wasn't fully compliant with council requirements and certifications to run the commercial operation that we have had in place for the past 16 years. We have rectified this and worked with third party specialists and the council and have this now under control. We anticipate formal confirmation to support our operation in the coming months. In the interim we have the full support of council to continue to run our operation as we always have.

We are extremely fortunate to have a venue such as ours in an amazing location that generates a healthy return. The Surf Club is the primary driver of revenue into the Avoca Beach Surf Lifesaving Club and without it, we would be a significantly different operation. While The Surf Club is a venue owned by its members to enjoy, we exist solely to support the broader club to maintain being one of the safest beaches in NSW and most competitive surf sports clubs that prides itself on training and education of water safety for the community. For decades we have continued to build on this and the next horizon we will look to grow this further with continued investment into both areas of beach safety and sports. This will require continued growth in The Surf Club to ensure we have this venue deliver increased revenue back to the club over many years to come. Shortly we will outline the strategy to achieve this. For now, we thank ALL our great staff for the effort and work they put into making a visit to The Surf Club a memorable experience. Most importantly we thank our MEMBERS for

their ongoing support of the venue. Everyone is a frustrated chef or venue manager and always have suggestions on improvements and we welcome these. The 2024/2025 season once again demonstrated the strength and spirit of the Avoca Beach Surf Life Saving Club's education program. Each year, we proudly welcome new and returning members who challenge themselves to learn vital lifesaving skills - growing individually while contributing to our supportive and skilled community. This year was no exception.

Our training calendar featured a diverse suite of courses tailored to the varied ages and capabilities of our members. A total of 145 qualifications were delivered and successfully attained:

44 Bronze Medallions, 12 First Aid, 33 Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC), 19 Resuscitation, 8 Advanced Resuscitation, 15 IRB Crew, 8 IRB Driver (Silver Medallion), 6 Radio Operator Certificate.

In addition to new certifications, annual skills maintenance remained a critical task. Ensuring all active members remained proficient and current in their qualifications by year-end required a coordinated effort. This process not only reinforced essential skills but also incorporated updated training content to enhance readiness for patrol duties and competitive surf lifesaving events.

Our success this season would not have been possible without the dedication and passion of our volunteer education team. I extend my sincere thanks to

RESCUE OF THE YEAR

GOOD FRIDAY RESCUE - JACKSON ENGLISH, CHRIS PARKER, NIGEL TEBB



As the sun went down on Thursday night 17th April 2025, the predicted Huge SE swell started to arrive. As the sun rose on Friday morning the predicted swell had hit 14 foot from the SE, 15 second interval with SW winds. People started to gather on the point to watch the huge waves, the power of which we hadn't seen for a while. At 6:30am a group of local surfers decided to paddle out. Some from the beach and others from the rocks. What they didn't anticipate was the drag and rip that was happening in the water. As the sets rolled in the water went back out and was running all the way around the point making it very difficult to paddle and stay in a safe area.

About 6:55am a member of the public made some club members aware that there were 4-5 people in trouble in the water. They were being pushed around by the swell and unable to return to shore. Jackson English, Nigel Tebb &

Chris Parker were checking out the surf thinking about heading out themselves. It was at this time that they became aware of the situation. It was without hesitation that they said "LETS GO" and "GET THE IRB".

Chris & Jackson grabbed some lifejackets and radios and brought the IRB down to the waterline. Nigel grabbed a rescue tube and headed around the rocks. They launched the IRB with Jacko driving and Parkesy as the crew. As they took off from the beach there was a huge amount of foam on the water making the motor cavitate, but that didn't stop them. They locked in and went for it, as they did they noticed 3 to 4 huge sets breaking and had to come back and set up again. Remember these were waves approx. 12 foot, the size of a 2 story house. After assessing the waves they made a run for it. Full throttle they went for it and as they came up to a wave they had to do a sharp

turn left to avoid the powerful set approaching. They made it then off they went, gunning it through the break in hope no more sets would come. They made it out & searched for the two boys in trouble.

We've had a fantastic year at the grassroots of surf life saving.

This season, we welcomed record numbers of nippers to Avoca Beach. These youngsters, starting from just five years old, are the future of surf life saving. They are tomorrow's lifesavers who will be patrolling our beaches for generations to come.

Our Sunday Nippers program ran every week throughout the season, offering plenty of fun, learning, and memorable experiences for everyone involved. The focus remains on building confidence, developing skills, and forging friendships. Our age groups continue to grow year after year, with new families joining and many giving nippers a go for the first time.

A special highlight this year was our U14 age group, with 27 juniors earning their Surf Rescue Certificate - their first formal qualification in surf rescue, recognising their training, skills, and competency. Guided by our talented club educators, these young lifesavers are now contributing directly to the safety of our beaches.

Surf life saving is one of the few sports that so uniquely combines community volunteering with competitive spirit. Each of our newly qualified U14s will need to complete 25 hours of patrol

time to be eligible to compete at next year's Australian titles, a valuable experience in both service and sport.

Our junior club captains, Samuel Wetti and Mia Jamal, have done stellar work throughout the season, modelling leadership and upholding the values of our club. Alongside Tully Craik, they represented Avoca at the SLSCC Junior Leadership Course, gaining invaluable life experiences and insights.

Mia has had an outstanding year. Not only did she serve as our female junior club captain, she was also named SLSCC's Female Junior Lifesaver of the Year, and went on to be crowned NSW Junior Lifesaver of the Year. A remarkable achievement that speaks to her dedication, resilience, and natural talent.

Junior surf sports at Avoca have gone from strength to strength. The passion of our athletes, coaches, age managers, and parents is what truly sets our club apart. The kids train hard year-round, and behind them stands a devoted support crew braving early mornings, challenging surf, and juggling work commitments, all to help the next generation thrive.

The season kicked off with a carnival at Forster and the Coolangatta Gold, with many of our competitors starting their training as early as July. Their efforts paid off with victories across several age groups.

Avoca athletes dominated selections for the Central Coast Inter-Branch Team. We achieved a record-breaking club point score at the Junior Branch Titles, surpassing 1,000 points. At the major end-of-season events, our nippers brought home multiple medals from the weather-affected Junior State Titles and we had champions at the Aussies.

All in all, it's been a massive, successful year, one that simply wouldn't have been possible without the incredible support of our sponsors, parents, and volunteers. Thank you to everyone who helped make it happen.

The spirit of our club is strong, from the bottom up. That strength bodes well for the future of surf life saving and the safety of our community.
