Always asking in the team how do we grow. 33% growth this year

Making sure we do the right things from an efficiency perspective as well

Improved menu, lunchtime trading on weekends has increased. Live music, functions and events have increased and have been successful.

Great venue for functions - weddings, parties and wakes have underpinned some of the growth.

It's been tough from a cost perspective - we try to keep pricing in line with the increases. We need to stay competitive but also recover costs. Changes in suppliers and buying better have been some of the strategies. Trying to keep local suppliers and using Lion Nathan.

Profit & Loss

2025 net profit of \$318,909.89

Moving forward doing the budget this coming Wednesday at the August board meeting. We have the basics in play already so there won't be as big an amount of growth. Big growth won't come without big capital upgrades. Keep community focus as heart whilst still growing.

Thank you to Stu Harvey for filling the space as well as the Leadership team - Kristy Probst, Emma Denniss, Michael Hunt and Pavarne Lambert - they have been driving the success and stepping up to fill in as needed while the role was vacant. On the outside operations may have seemed to be running smoothly but that's because there was a lot of work going on in the background from the team.

Bobby Dorrell: It's been wonderful to be a member since 1953 and to see the way it's become a business has been a wonderful experience in my lifetime. The Annual Report was printed by Bob Pickett - I want to congratulate the club and the board being run by competent people. Thank you.

Stuart Harvey:

Annual reports are on the website - a jotform will be coming around so you can purchase a colour printed version for around \$20.

We've given back \$43k back in member discounts. No discounts on a discount which has caused some confusion. Over \$1m on wages spent, this might change some things with the tax but we are moving into that bracket with all the growth. We have been working hard with our staff to pull back on wages by sending staff home when business is slow. Emma has stepped in to manage HR for the last 8 weeks. Going forward we will need a General Manager due to the growth in the business. This will happen down the track.

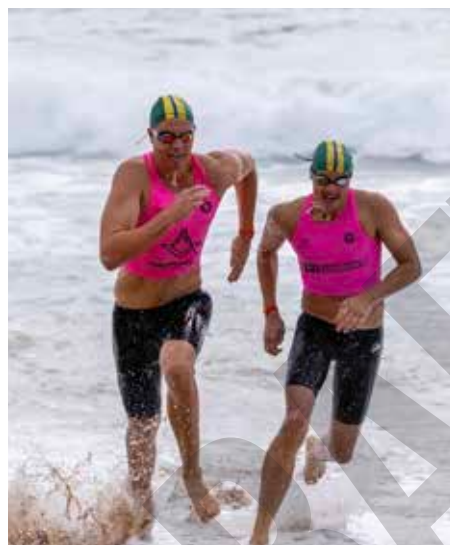

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

CLUB PRESIDENT, STUART HARVEY

It is with great pride that I present the President's Report for the 2025/2026 season of Avoca Beach Surf Life Saving Club.

This season has been one of exceptional growth, performance, and community impact. Our total membership reached 1,320 members, representing a 24% increase over the past four years. This continued growth reflects the strength of our club culture, our inclusivity, and the commitment of our members across all areas of the organisation.

Beyond the numbers, what stands out most is the level of engagement across the club. From our newest junior members through to our Life Members, there is a shared sense of pride and ownership that continues to drive Avoca Beach forward. This culture is something that cannot be manufactured – it is built over time through the contribution of many, and it remains one of our greatest strengths.

LIFESAVING OPERATIONS

At the heart of everything we do is our commitment to keeping our beach safe. This season, our 14 Patrol teams once again delivered an outstanding performance, completing just under 10,000 hours of volunteer patrols.

Our members carried out 1,040 preventative actions and performed 57 rescues throughout the season. Most importantly, we are proud to report that there were no lives lost on Avoca Beach while our patrols were on duty.

These results are a direct reflection of the professionalism, vigilance, and dedication of our Patrol Captains and patrol members. Their ability to make sound decisions, often in high-pressure situations, ensures that

our beach remains one of the safest on the Central Coast.

We also acknowledge the leadership shown by our Patrol Captains, who continue to set high standards in both performance and team culture. Their role in mentoring younger members and maintaining operational readiness is critical to our ongoing success.

EDUCATION AND TRAINING

Education remains a cornerstone of our success and operational readiness. This season saw significant achievements across all levels of training, including:

- 620 proficiencies completed
- 50 Bronze Medallions awarded
- 14 IRB awards
- 13 Advanced Resuscitation Certificates
- 39 Surf Rescue Certificates awarded

These are outstanding results and demonstrate the depth of capability within our club. The strength of our education program ensures that we not only meet, but exceed, the standards required to deliver effective lifesaving services.

Our athletes have once again delivered exceptional results across all areas of surf sports, including beach, craft, boats, pool rescue, masters, and lifesaving events.

The club has produced Australian and State Champions this season, highlighting the strength and depth of our competitive program. These achievements are not only a reflection of individual talent but also of the strong coaching structure that supports our athletes.

Beyond results, it is important to recognise the role that surf sports plays in preparing our members for lifesaving duties. Fitness, discipline, and teamwork developed through competition directly translate to improved capability on patrol.

It has been another rewarding and successful season for the patrol members of Avoca Beach Surf Life Saving Club, and I am incredibly proud of what we have achieved together.

First and foremost, I would like to thank every single patrolling member who volunteered their time throughout the season. Whether you completed one patrol or many, your commitment to protecting the public and supporting your fellow members is what makes our club such a respected and trusted part of the community. Every hour spent on the beach represents time given freely to keep others safe, and that dedication should never be taken for granted.

This season our patrol teams watched over more than 192,000 visitors to Avoca Beach. During that time our members carried out:

- 57 rescues
- 97 first aid incidents
- 1,040 preventative actions

These numbers tell an impressive story, but they only capture part of what our members do. Behind every statistic is a volunteer who made the decision to step forward and help someone in need. Whether it was providing reassurance to a distressed swimmer, delivering first aid, preventing someone from entering dangerous conditions, or performing a rescue in challenging surf, our members consistently demonstrated professionalism, teamwork and compassion.

Our preventative actions continue to be one of our greatest successes. Every conversation with a beachgoer, every relocation between the flags and every warning issued helps prevent emergencies before they happen. 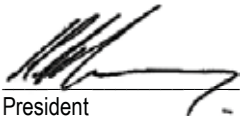

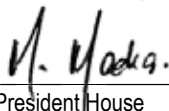

Notes To The Concise Financial Statements For The Financial Year Ended 30 April 2026

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This concise financial report is an extract derived from the full financial report of Avoca Beach Surf Life Savings Club Incorporated for the year ended 30 April 2026. The financial statements and specific disclosures have been prepared in accordance with AASB 1039 Concise Financial Reports and the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*, the *Associations Incorporations Act 2009 (NSW)*, the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991* and associated regulations.

The full financial report, including detailed accounting policies and independent auditor's report, is available upon request from the Club or can be viewed online at the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits* web site.

The concise financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs, except where otherwise noted. All amounts are presented in Australian Dollars (\$) and are rounded to the nearest thousand dollars, unless otherwise stated.

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are consistent with those of the previous financial year.

- a) Revenue Recognition: Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Revenue are recognised when the performance obligations of a contract are satisfied.
- b) Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value
- c) Buildings are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event that the carrying amount of buildings is greater than its estimated recoverable amount the decrease in value is shown in the profit and loss statement as a revaluation decrease

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event the carrying amount of plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses are recognised in the profit or loss as revaluation decreases if the impairment losses relate to the revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets, including buildings and capitalised lease assets is depreciated on a straight line or diminishing-value basis over the asset's useful life to the entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are:

Class of Fixed Asset	Depreciation Rate
Plant and Equipment	5 – 66%
Office Equipment	15%
Furniture & Fittings	5 – 66%
Leasehold Improvements	10%
Surf Patrol & Sports Equipment	20%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at end of each reporting period.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with carrying amount. These gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss in the period which they arise. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

- d) Income tax, As the company is a charitable institution in the terms of subsection 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.
- e) Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the company during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

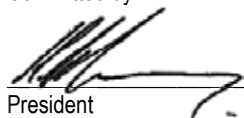

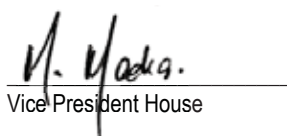

Report on the Financial Report

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial report of Avoca Beach Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated (the Club), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 April 2026, statement of profit or loss & other comprehensive income, statement of changes in members' funds and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, notes comprising a summary of material accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the committee members' declaration.

In our opinion, except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section of our report, the financial report of Avoca Beach Surf Life Saving Club Inc. is in accordance with *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*, including:

- (a) giving a true and fair view of the Club's financial position as at 30 April 2026 and of its performance for the year ended on that date; and
- (b) complying with Australian Accounting Standards as set out in Note 1 and the requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) 2009*, and the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2013*.
- (c) the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991*, including

Due to the nature of the Club inventory, we are unable to satisfy ourselves by alternative means the inventory quantities recognised as at 30 April 2026. As a result, we were unable to determine if any adjustment with respect to the existence of inventory recorded is necessary and related impact on the statement of profit or loss & other comprehensive income.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. We are independent of the Club in accordance with the auditor independence requirements and ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional accountants (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

The 2025/26 season has been another highly productive and successful year for Education at Avoca Beach Surf Life Saving Club. Education remains one of the most important foundations of the club, supporting operational readiness while also developing the confidence, leadership, and lifesaving capability of our members. Throughout the season, the commitment shown by our trainers, facilitators, assessors, and volunteers ensured members had access to quality training opportunities in a supportive and professional environment.

A major focus at the beginning of the season was the completion of member proficiencies. Ensuring all active members remain current and confident in their lifesaving skills is essential to maintaining strong patrol standards and delivering safe and effective services on the beach. This season, the Education Team introduced an increased focus on practical and detailed CPR refresher training, delivering more than 50 one-hour in-depth CPR sessions throughout the season. These sessions provided members with valuable hands-on experience and the opportunity to refresh critical skills in resuscitation, patient assessment, and emergency response procedures.

The CPR sessions were extremely well received by members across all patrol groups. Many members commented positively on the practical nature of the training and the additional time spent reinforcing scenarios and real-life applications. The strong attendance at these sessions demonstrated the commitment of our members to maintaining a high standard of operational capability and highlighted the positive culture of ongoing learning within the club.

In addition to proficiency training, the club continued to deliver a broad range of awards. These courses are essential in developing new lifesavers while also providing existing members with opportunities to further expand their qualifications and operational skills. The Education Team worked hard throughout the season to coordinate training schedules, assessment opportunities, and water safety support to ensure members could successfully complete their awards.

The continued strength in Surf Rescue Certificate and Bronze Medallion numbers has been particularly pleasing. These awards form the backbone of surf lifesaving operations and provide members with the skills and confidence required to participate in patrols and emergency responses. It has been encouraging to see many younger members progressing through these courses and becoming active contributors to the club's patrol teams.

The completion of Advanced Resuscitation, IRB, and Radio awards has also strengthened the club's operational capability across multiple areas. These qualifications provide essential advanced skills that support patrol effectiveness and emergency response readiness during the busy patrol season.

The Education Team would like to sincerely acknowledge the outstanding contribution of all trainers, facilitators, assessors, and water safety personnel who dedicated significant time and effort throughout the season. Delivering educational programs requires many volunteer hours both on and off the beach, including course preparation, administration, mentoring, assessment coordination, and practical training support. The willingness of members to contribute their

experience and knowledge continues to be one of the greatest strengths of the club.

From the first pre-season sessions through to the final races at Aussies, it wasn't just about results – it was about the way our rowers, sweeps, supporters and families came together to create an environment where people wanted to be involved.

One of the most pleasing aspects of the season was seeing so many rowers embrace the standards and expectations that have become synonymous with Avoca surf boats. Whether it was turning up for pre-dawn training sessions, attending patrols, helping at fundraising events, working the BBQ, maintaining equipment or supporting teammates, there was a willingness across the section to contribute. Success in surf boats has never been built solely on what happens between the turning cans, and this season was another reminder of that.

The commitment shown by our younger athletes was impressive. With a significant portion of our rowing group made up of Under 23 competitors, the future of the section looks exceptionally strong. Watching these younger crews develop throughout the season while learning from some of our experienced rowers and sweeps was one of the highlights of the year.

A key development this season was the introduction of a more structured and professional training approach through Grant “Wilko” Wilkinson. Wilko brought a perspective and designed comprehensive gym, ergometer and rowing programs that challenged our athletes to improve and maximise their potential. The results were evident throughout the season, but our rowers gained a better understanding of what it takes to perform consistently at a high level.

We were also fortunate to spend time working with Mike Shirvington, whose breathwork and leadership workshops encouraged us to look beyond physical performance. Through these sessions we explored our values, behaviours and purpose as a group, taking the opportunity to define what we want the Avoca surf boat section to represent. These conversations reinforced what many of us already knew – that our greatest strength lies in our people and the culture we continue to build together.

The season delivered several memorable moments that will be remembered for years to come.

At the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships, our Under 19 Female crew, the “CCSS”, achieved something by claiming the Australian Title and bringing home a Gold Medal. To stand on top of the podium at Aussies is the culmination of years of hard work and dedication, and everyone associated with the crew should be proud.

Adding to this achievement was the outstanding performance of our second Under 19 Female crew, the “Yabbies”, who progressed all the way through to the Australian Final and finished sixth. Having two Avoca crews compete in the same Under 19 Female Australian Final was a first for our club and demonstrated the depth of talent emerging within our ranks.

Away from competition, the arrival and christening of our new surf boat, the Andy Hoban, was another major milestone. Made possible through the generosity of the Moran family, the new boat represents an investment in future generations of Avoca rowers and is something the entire section can be proud of.

None of these achievements happen without support. Behind every crew is a group of people who quietly give their time, energy and expertise to help others succeed. Our sweeps, coaches, mentors, boat builders, organisers, volunteers and supporters continue to form the backbone of the section. Their contribution often goes unseen, but it is never unnoticed.

RESCUE OF THE YEAR

New Year's Eve at Avoca Beach was a challenging day, with large surf conditions resulting in multiple rescues carried out by Council lifeguards while on duty. As conditions deteriorated further, the beach was closed for the final hour as swimming became too dangerous.

Despite the conditions, many members of the Avoca Beach community gathered on the grass along the Point to watch the powerful surf roll in as the year came to a close.

At approximately 6:40pm, members of Avoca Beach Surf Club witnessed a person being pulled from the surf. They immediately recognised the seriousness of the situation and raced back to the club to alert senior members and parents that a person had been brought from the water and appeared unconscious.

Club members responded without hesitation, arriving with vital first-aid and medical equipment. Along with another member already on scene and the support of an off-duty medical professional, they commenced CPR. Thanks to the

training, preparation and medical knowledge of our members, early defibrillation was administered. CPR continued while the defibrillator was in use, which very likely saved the man's life.

After several shocks and continuous CPR, the patient regained his heartbeat and soon after regained breathing. Ambulance NSW then arrived, along with medical professionals who are also members of our club. The patient was carefully transferred to a waiting ambulance and transported to a nearby sports field, where the Westpac Rescue Helicopter had just landed.

Once stabilised, the patient was airlifted to hospital in a very serious condition.

We are incredibly proud of all members of Avoca Beach Surf Club – from the young SRC holders who first raised the alarm, to the senior members who responded with speed, professionalism and calm under pressure. Our footage shows it took just three minutes from the time the man was pulled from the water to the arrival of vital medical equipment.

A huge thank you also goes to the members of the public who assisted. This was a true community effort, and without everyone working together, this man may not have made it off the beach alive.

The patient, Clinton, returned home to his family on the coast following time in hospital and several major procedures. Clinton and his family have expressed their immense gratitude for the response and visited the club to meet some of the people who helped save Clinton's life and personally thanked them.

This outcome is a testament to the skill, preparation and dedication of everyone involved. To our members, emergency responders and members of the public who stepped in when it mattered most – thank you. Your swift actions, teamwork and professionalism directly contributed to saving Clinton's life, and you should be incredibly proud of what you achieved.

“A CENTRAL PILLAR OF OUR YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM IS NIPPERS, WHICH IS DESIGNED TO BUILD CONFIDENCE AND DEVELOP FUNDAMENTAL SURF LIFESAVING SKILLS IN OUR YOUNGEST MEMBERS”

As the season concludes, it is appropriate to reflect on what has been an exceptionally successful and productive year.

A central pillar of our youth development program is Nippers, which is designed to build confidence and develop fundamental surf lifesaving skills in our youngest members. This year saw record participation, with more than 400 children under the age of 14 registered in our Sunday Nippers program.

Our club also continues to support one of the largest contingents of junior surf lifesaving athletes in the country, competing at branch, state, and national levels. These athletes demonstrate a high level of commitment, undertaking training multiple times per week. In recent years, pre-season training

has commenced earlier to ensure athletes are optimally prepared for competition.

Across all beach and water disciplines, our junior athletes have achieved outstanding results, with medal success and recognition at levels not seen for over a decade. A detailed summary of these achievements is provided later in this report.

Our junior members represent the future of beach safety. This year, 35 junior participants successfully completed their Surf Rescue Certificates, formally recognising them as qualified lifesavers. These members have since joined active patrols, contributing their time and effort to help ensure the safety of both local community members and visitors.

In addition, several junior members were formally recognised for their significant contributions to the SLSCC rescue of the year, highlighting the meaningful role they already play within the organisation.

Underlying all junior activities is a dedicated group of volunteers who generously contribute their time and expertise. These individuals support programs from early morning through to late in the day, often without seeking recognition. The Club acknowledges and sincerely thanks all volunteers for their ongoing commitment and invaluable contribution to the success of our junior program.

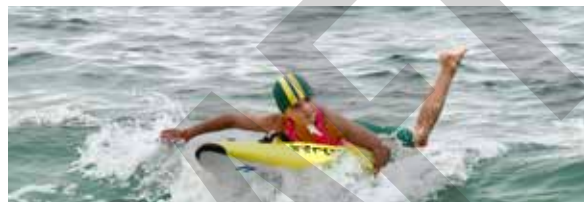
